Responding to Archie Cochrane's criticism

1978 The UK Department of Health and WHO funded the National Perinatal Epidemiology Unit to compile a register of controlled trials of perinatal care

1985-1989

An international collaboration was convened to prepare systematic reviews of <u>all</u> controlled trials in pregnancy and childbirth.





Initiating The Cochrane Collaboration

February 1992

The success of ECPC, GECPC, & ODPT led the NHS R&D Programme to fund 'a Cochrane Centre'

'to collaborate with others, in the UK and elsewhere, to facilitate systematic, up-todate reviews of randomized controlled trials of health care'

October 1993

The UK Cochrane Centre convened a 2-day colloquium in Oxford at which c. 80 participants agreed to establish an international Cochrane collaboration
